

We, the undersigned wish to rescind resolution 20-5 passed at the Council Extraordinary meeting of the 13th January 2020. Resolution 20- 5 is set out below.

20 - 5 RESOLVED

THAT Council make urgent representations to our State Member Mr Paul Toole, to request that the Premier Gladys Berejiklian, undertake urgent negotiations with the Zig Zag Railway Co-Op Limited to, on an 'interim basis', take lawful possession of the whole of the Heritage Railway site' and promptly have the legal owners of the site, the State Government Department of Planning and Infrastructure undertake a full restoration of the Heritage Railway site, including its railway engines, carriages, railway lines and building assets, bush fire prevention work, development of a future safety regulator; such that when all fully completed, it can be handed back to the volunteers of the Zig Zag Railway Co-Op Ltd to resume full rail public passenger operations to provide an urgent long-term boost to tourism across both Lithgow and the Blue Mountains.


