ITEM: 4 BOCSAR CRIME STATISTICS

SUMMARY

The NSW Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research (BOCSAR) Crime Trends Statistics were provided for the committee's consideration.

COMMENTARY

The most recent BOCSAR crime trends report shows the incidence of various offences from 2014/15 to 2018/19 as well as the rates per 100,000 population.

This report shows that the trends in the incidences of most crimes over this 5 year period were stable or insignificant other than the following:

Non domestic violence related assault: up 8% Intimidation stalking and harassment: up 10.5%

Break and enter dwelling: down 16.2 % Break and enter non-dwelling: down 29.5% Steal from motor vehicle: down 16.1%

Fraud: up 6.1% (including internet and phone scams and fail to pay offences)

Malicious damage to property: down 3.6%

Breach bail: up 13.8% (including breach of bail curfew conditions)

Breach AVO: up 18% (can in part be attributed to more frequent compliance

checks by Police)
