ITEM: 4 BOCSAR CRIME STATISTICS

SUMMARY

The NSW Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research (BOCSAR) Crime Trends Statistics were provided for the committee's consideration.

COMMENTARY

The most recent BOCSAR crime trends report to March 2020 shows the incidence of various offences as follows:

Lithgow Trends in violent and property offences over the 60 months to March 2020 (page 13)

- Violent offences 6% average per annum increase over last 5 years
- Property offences 27.6% average per annum increase over last 2 years

Lithgow Trends in recorded criminal incidents for major offences over the 24 months to March 2020 (page 27):

- Domestic Violence related assault up14.2%
- Break and enter non dwelling up 74.2 %
- Steal from Motor vehicle up 56.4%
- Steal from retail store up 47.7%

Ratio of Lithgow rate to NSW rate of recorded criminal incidents per 100,000 population over 12 months to March 2020. Only incidents with significant variations shown. (Page 29)

- Sexual assault Lithgow rate was 2.3 times the NSW rate
- Break and enter non dwelling Lithgow rate was 2 times the NSW rate
- Steal from dwelling Lithgow rate was 2 times the NSW rate

It was noted that the next quarterly BOCSAR report will show data for the Covid 19 lockdown period of April, May and June and it is expected that there will be reductions in Alcohol Related Crime but significant increases in Domestic Violence Related Assaults.

ITEM: 5 POLICE REPORT

SUMMARY

Clr Goodwin provided a report on local crime and policing activities.

COMMENTARY

For the 3 months March, April and May 2020 there were 50 recorded domestic violence related assaults in the Lithgow command. This compares to 121 for the full 12 months to March 2020 shown in Item 4 above and suggests a significant spike related to Covid 19 lockdowns. There were a further 18 Breach AVO offences and 60 Domestic Violence Reported but No Action Taken incidents (eg where Police are unable to substantiate the offence) during the same 3 months. Less Alcohol Related crime (other than related to Domestic Violence) has been observed by Police and will be confirmed in next crime report.

Covid 19 has also led to there being more Police available for general duties due to Police training courses being cancelled and less court appearances which normally take Police off the street. There have been 6 general duties Police Officers available during this time, up from the usual 4.

There has been an increase in public use of the Newnes Plateau area since Covid 19 restrictions have been eased. The Police are moving people on wherever possible and signage will be installed at each entrance warning of applicable offences. There have also been reports of firearms use after dark which Police are investigating.

The Committee asked Clr Goodwin to pass on its thanks to the Police for the valuable work they have been doing during this difficult time.

To date, there have been no Black Lives Matter protest activities in the Lithgow area.
