

Bushfire recovery work underway in Lithgow LGA

The NRRA has created a mapping tool of bushfire affected local government areas (LGAs) which shows what recovery work is happening in each area.



The LGA mapping tool breaks down key statistical information about the LGA, the impact the bushfires had in the area and what recovery efforts and funding has been spent to date.

Each LGA profile snapshot includes information about the areas:

- Demographics
- Key business/industries and agricultural commodities
- Recovery activities and associated funding provided broken down into:
 - human and social recovery
 - economic recovery, and
 - Environmental recovery

The map is updated every month and will be expanded in the near future to include other disasters, not just bushfire.

Asset Protection Zone Requirements

An Asset Protection Zone (APZ) is a fuel reduced area surrounding a built asset or structure. This can include any residential building or major building such as farm and machinery sheds, or industrial, commercial or heritage buildings.

The NSW RFS has a 'Standards for Asset Protection Zones' document that sets out the requirement for establishing and maintaining APZs. You can access the standards **HERE**.

NEW COVID-19 SUPPORT PACKAGE FOR BUSINESSES

A new grants package has been announced by the NSW Treasurer this week to support small businesses and people across the state impacted by the current restrictions.

This includes the extension of the Dine & Discover vouchers to Tuesday, 31 August 2021. The Dine vouchers will also apply to takeaway orders delivered directly to homes.

The Small Business Support Grants will help businesses by alleviating cashflow constraints while trading is restricted. This can be used for expenses like rent, utilities and wages for which no other government support is available.

The package includes grants that are dependent on the decline in turnover experienced during the restrictions:

\$10,000 for a 70% decline \$7,000 for a 50% decline \$5,000 for a 30% decline

The grants will be divided into two streams:

A) Small Business COVID-19 Support Grant
B) Hospitality and Tourism COVID-19 Support Grant

The criteria will be available on the **Service NSW** website in the coming days.

LOCAL BUSHFIRE RECOVERY PROJECTS ANNOUNCED

A total of 9 local projects within the Lithgow LGA will receive a well-deserved funding boost, resulting from the crippling 2019/2020 bushfire season.

A total of 15 projects across the Calare electorate will share in \$16.5 million in funding, close to half that funding coming to the Lithgow region.

Lithgow LGA projects include:-

- \$2,763,500.00 to upgrade the Glow Worm Tunnel visitor precinct.
- \$990,000.00 to construct an emergency fire shelter in the centre of the Wolgan Valley
- \$919,206.00 for Habitat for Humanity to work alongside vulnerable residents and volunteers to clear burned debris and fire prone vegetation
- \$720,500.00 will go to the Australian Ecosystems Foundation Inc (AEFI) to build a Wildlife Rescue and Rehabilitation Hospital adjacent to Secret Creek Sanctuary.
- \$615,500.00 to construct a Community/Visitor Centre in Lithgow.
- \$503,000.00 to support the Lithgow District Chamber of Commerce's efforts to boost jobs and investment through the Lithgow business revival program.
- \$486,747.00 to fund the purchase of a fixed diesel generator for Lithgow's evacuation centre.
- \$326,675.00 for Headspace Lithgow and Chifley/Lithgow Rural Fire Service (RFS) to establish an RFS cadetship program titled 'Youth Beyond the Flame.'
- \$270,000.00 to construct the Capertee Recreation Reserve Bike and Walking Trail.

INMATE ART'S FIERY ORIGINS

Lithgow Correctional Centre staff and inmates have collaborated in the aftermath of the Gosper's Mountain bushfire to create a unique sculpture series.

The sculptures are displayed on the mountainside next to the prison and were created from lengths of charred, scrap barbed wire from fences destroyed by the December 2019 fire.

Overseer Steven Redman gathered the wire and with the help of inmates, recycled it into three, tree-like sculptures that stand in memory of the blaze.

The installation and performance entitled **Salvage** is based on the recovery experience following the bushfires that devastated Lithgow and surrounding localities. The work, which is created by participants from the Lithgow community under the guidance of Trybal productions, involves the creation of sound and music works, Video storytelling, digital modalities, Virtual Reality, augmented reality and live performance.

One of the key themes Salvage will focus on is "we can learn from the past but we don't have to live there" the project will help to bring out a positive narrative which will show how resilient the Lithgow community is as individuals work together to support each through difficult times and despite the difficulties we can learn and together create a positive sustainable future.

The Free Art Installation and performance is driven by people's lived experiences of the catastrophic bushfires, with personal stories at the heart of the work. Salvage will be held at the Lithgow Union Theatre on Saturday 9th October.

Bushfire restoration tree planting grants

Have you heard about Foundation for National Parks and Wildlife's (FNPW) Tree Planting grants?

Eligible applicants are invited to support tree planting projects as part of bushfire restoration projects in and around regions affected by the 2019-20 Black Summer bushfires.

The FNPW bushfire recovery project goal is to plant one million trees throughout fire-affected areas by December 2024.

Grants in this round are for in-kind support for the supply of trees sourced through one of the FNPW Bushfire Recovery Nurseries.
