NATURAL DISASTER DECLARATION - LOANS, TRANSPORT SUBSIDIES AND HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE

A Natural Disaster Declaration is in place for the Lithgow Local Government Area for the severe storm and flash flooding as of 11 January 2022.


